### Suggested Management

Cold Stream Pond is excellent togue and salmon water. Spawning area for the togue is good; however, the stream spawning area for salmon is limited. The recent construction of a fishway at the outlet provides access to the only good spawning area for salmon. Until the spawning run of salmon is increased, annual stocking of the lake with salmon is recommended.

The stocking of any species other than togue and landlocked salmon is not recommended. Extreme care should be taken to prevent the introduction of bass or other warm-water fish not already present. It is recommended that all length, size and bag limits be removed on white perch and pickerel, and that the open season on white perch coincide with the opening and closing dates for trout and salmon.
